
Daily Schedule

Time	Activity	Description
8:45-9:15am	Arrival	Campers will be greeted by a coach at the bus and car drop off area and brought in groups to the Fencing Room
9:15-9:30am	Warm-up	Run/Stretch/Calisthenics
9:30- 11am	Morning Drills	Fencing Instruction
11- 11:45am	Gym/Outside Games	Any games the kids want to play
11:45- 1pm	Lunch/Pool Time	All walk down to cafeteria, after done eating option to free swim/playground
1:15- 1:30am	Warm-up	Run/Stretch/Calisthenics
1:30- 3:pm	Afternoon Drills	Fencing Instruction
3:15-3:45	Canteen	All walk down to cafeteria/ group free time
4- 415pm	Busses Depart	Go Home!



Session Schedule

Day	Goal	Description
1	Introductions	Go over rules, expectations, camp norms History of Fencing, basics of the sport
2	Gear Distributed	Each camper will be fitted for and given 1 glove, 1 mask, 1 underarm protector, 1 jacket
3	Footwork	By this day all campers will have become familiar with all footwork
4	Blade work introduced	By the end of this day each camper will learn how each of the fencing weapons are used
5	Introduction to Bouting	This is the day students will be prepared to duel/bout
6	Choose your weapon	Campers will choose 1 of the 3 weapons to master
7	Lessons	One on one lessons, group fencing drills
8	Prepare for Battle	Set up for competition, Practice "Fencing Pools"
9	Competition Day!	Full Day competition, parents invited for 1-3pm
10	Fun Day!	Free Fencing,
